A. AMELL VARIANCE REQUEST

Mr. and Ms. John Amell, owners or agents of property located at 2258 South Shore Drive, that being tax parcel #0311-320-524-00, request variances from sections 38-242(1) and 38-471(2) of the Zoning Code. These sections require a front yard of at least 40'. Mr. and Mrs. Amell wish to raze an existing home and accessory building on this parcel and build a new home and a new accessory building. These structures would not meet the 40' front yard requirement and the accessory building would be located in an area considered to be a front yard. Chuck Posthumus, architect for the Amell's, explained the project to the board.

David Weishaar opened the public hearing. Bob Malone of 2261 Maksaba Trail stated that he and his wife Mary have no objections to the project. Hearing no other comments, Weishaar closed the public hearing.

Board members commended Posthumus for the thoroughness of his explanation of the project.
